Edward M. Curr (1820 –
1889) visited Melbourne for
the first time in August 1839,
almost four years to the day
after Fawcner's Enterprise had
sailed up the Yarra. Although
Curr could not claim priority
over Fawcner or Batman as a
pioneer of Melbourne, his book
*Recollections of Squatting in
Victoria* (1883) remains one of
the most prominent chronicles
of Victoria's early history. Furphy
will explore Curr's unusual life
and discuss his historical legacy.
