- 2. Which City of Melbourne pedestrian thoroughfare received a "Royal" opening in 1983?
- 3. The Capitol Theatre opened in 1924 with the original version of which epic movie?
- 4. The Melbourne Metro Tunnel is due for completion in 2025. Can you name the 5 underground stations currently under construction?
- 5. Which City of Melbourne public utility was designed by Arthur James Arnot who also managed this facility between 1894 and 1901?
- 6. Name the suburban riverside boulevard that was constructed by workers during the depression while receiving 'susso pay?'
