Please outline your views about the permit application:

No one doubts the significance of this extraordinary building even despite the fact that it has suffered the indignity of having 9 bays removed to accommodate the extension of Collins Street.

Central to the significance of the building is, of course, it length and this can still be appreciated by viewing the two parts under the Collins Street Bridge from either end of Village Street and Aurora Lane.

We therefor see little additional benefit resulting from the further demolition of original fabric contemplated in this proposal.

Although some reconstruction is proposed to bring the two parts of the shed closer together this cannot compensate for the major changes proposed to the form and character of the building through the need to provide for supports for the twin towers and accommodate the future uses proposed.

We also submit that the height and bulk of the two towers will overwhelm the heritage building.

We note that the applicant has chosen not to submit evidence that the substantial development contemplated is required in order to main the heritage building. We can therefor assume that the rent on the current tenancies provides a sufficient return to include adequate maintenance of the buildings.

It would therefor appear that the development proposal is a solution looking for a problem and is not necessary.
